Every year, on 24th of January, National Girl Child Day is celebrated all over the country to support girls and prosper respect and love for them amongst people. In the year 2008, the celebration of this special day dedicated to girls, was started by Women and Child Development Ministry, Government of India.

Till today, a lot of girls face inequality in the society with respect to their right to education, nutrition, legal rights, etc. The main objective of celebrating this day is to spread awareness in the society about these inequalities. The day is observed for enhancing opportunities for the girls in the country and to ensure that the girl children get respect and equality in rights. This day also focuses on making sure that the girl children become aware of their rights.

Therefore, on the occasion of National Girl Child Day 2021, various types of activities with girls were organized at various places by various partner organizations of the "Dasham Alliance" to create awareness and address issues related to girl child in society. The events organised on the 24th of January, saw a host of activities like song and dance performances, art and craft competitions, sports competitions, awareness talks and discussions with officials, political personality etc. especially with children. Each location saw many children participating and celebrating in the event along with organization staff and community associates. Several local officials also graced the events in different locations, giving us the perfect motivation speeches to the event.

Jan Chetna Sansthan as the name implies is an Organization working for



generating awareness among the people, leading to their empowerment. It was formed in 1988 by a group of social activists and development professionals. The field area of JCS is the tribals including women who constitute the most marginalized, disadvantaged and exploited section of the

society in tribal populated villages of Abu Road block and Pindwara in the Sirohi District of Rajasthan. Jan Chetna Sansthan has been working for the social welfare and development of tribal and nomadic communities in the Abroad block of Sirohi district for the last 3 decades. The organization runs education centers to promote the education of girls from these communities. The Rath Yatra was taken out with girls from the nomad community on the occasion of National Girl Child Day.

Minister) at their residence. Also, the demand letter was given by girls to the members of Alwar and Sapotra Legislative Assembly. In that demand letter, the girls highlighted important issues such as the importance of girl education, the impact of COVID 19 on the education system, the provision of free education and the protection of children after opening school.

URMUL (Rural Health, Research and Development) Trust



The URMUL Rural Health, Research and Development Trust, Bikaner was initiated by URMUL Dairy (Uttari Rajasthan Cooperative Milk Union Ltd.), Bikaner in 1983. National Girl Child Day was organized at Osiya Tehsil level in collaboration with Urmul Trust, Save the Children, Taluka Legal Services Committee and Ralsa and the government. More than 100 girls participated in the event and expressed their views on Girl's Day.

In that event, rangoli, mehndi and poster competitions were organized for the girls. Prizes were given to the girls participating in the competitions and all girls were welcomed by giving those Moments.

With this, the birthday of two girls born today was celebrated by cutting the cake. He was also presented a dress each.
