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Executive Summary

In order to pitch issues and problems faced by children among major political parties and incorporate those points in their manifestos, the workshop was organized with the theme of “*Dasham- Baccho ka Maang Patra*”. The event was inaugurated with lighting of the lamp. Dr. Shailendra Pandya, the speaker of the opening ceremony formally welcomed all the dignitaries present and children participants from various government and private schools accompanied by their teachers. He mentioned about the significance of organizing the workshop and shared its aims of putting forth the crucial issues in child protection to the implementing agency. He explained the uniqueness of this campaign and shared the list of organizations associated with the network to make this event a successful venture. The chief guest of inaugurating ceremony, Ms Sindhu Binujeet who was the representative of UNICEF Rajasthan addressed the event and expressed her elation for organizing such an event for the first time in Rajasthan. She motivated everyone to actively participate in the workshop and openly share their views in order to successfully achieve the objectives of the workshop. Special Guest, Dr. Rajkumari Bhargav, who is also a member of Child Welfare Committee, admired the efforts of conducting a regional level event focusing on the welfare of children. Dr. Shailendra then briefed about the activities to be conducted throughout the workshop. He informed about the flow of events and the structure of the program.

INTRODUCTION

Dasham- Baccho ka Maang Patra was a workshop/event to create a platform for the children to express and include their demands through manifesto in front of political parties. Before general election every political party accept manifesto from public on their interest. First time in history, children were involved to present their demands by preparing charter and both the major political party accepted and assured the children regarding inclusion of charter in their party manifesto of 2019 General Election. Also, representative of different agencies that they will bring demands of children at state level and higher.

It was organized by Bal Suraksha Network, Udaipur which was formed in the year 2008 with the objective of bringing all the voluntary organizations and individuals on a single platform who is working for the protection of the rights of children. The network includes various non-governmental organizations, social workers, members of Child Welfare Committee, professors and child protection representatives.

A 2-day workshop was organized at Youth Hostel situated in Khelgaon, Udaipur on 31st August and 1st September 2018 by Child Protection Network Udaipur under the guidance of Resource Institute for Human Rights and UNICEF. It was conducted to discuss upon the priority issues and problems faced by children which must be included in the manifesto of different political parties in *Vidhan Sabha* elections of Rajasthan state.

In context of Udaipur Division:

Present scenario of Children in remote areas of Udaipur district.

Udaipur division lies in southern part of Rajasthan which is a tribal dominated region in which 90% population belongs to ST and majorly is from *Meena* tribe. Children participates in workshop were from different level & blocks of Udaipur district. Children have also participated from different shelter homes, orphanages of Udaipur city and from different private and govt. school. Approximately 120 children participated in workshop from different schools and shelter homes of Udaipur city. In this region, people have very less awareness about the rights of children, social security schemes for children etc. Also bad practices like child trafficking, child labour and forced child begging is very high in comparison to other region of the state. Children from their young age got involved in bread earning activities due to many reasons i.e. working on restaurant, shops, begging etc. During this, mostly children start alcohol consumption, smoking and tobacco chewing and get addicted because of poor guidance. In 2008, Children right experts of the region form a common platform which was named Bal Suraksha Network to take initiatives against violence of child right. This year Bal Suraksha Network planned to organise a workshop and put demands of children in front of political party so the political party also can add the demands of children in their manifesto of assembly election.

Objectives of the consultation

The primary objectives of the workshop were to bring together regional experts and children on one platform, in order to:

1. Conduct series of regional workshops in the campaign and spread awareness on some of the critical issues faced by children in Rajasthan.
2. Create an open and common platform for government representatives, civil society organizations, individual social worker, child protection representatives and children to share their views and opinion on Child participation in democracy.
3. Prepare and submit charter of demands by children to representatives of both major political parties.
4. Ensure that children's opinions matter and their voices are heard at all levels.

PROCEDURE FOR THE CONSULTATION

SESSION 1

Welcome and Introductory Session very briefly

The event was inaugurated with lighting of the lamp. Dr. Shailendra Pandya, the speaker of the opening ceremony formally welcomed all the dignitaries present and children participants from various government and private schools accompanied by their teachers. He mentioned about the significance of organizing the workshop and shared its aims of putting forth the crucial issues in child protection to the implementing agency. He explained the uniqueness of this campaign and shared the list of organizations associated with the network to make this event a successful venture.

The chief guest of inaugurating ceremony, Sindhu Binujeet who was the representative of UNICEF Rajasthan addressed the event and expressed her elation for organizing such an event for the first time in Rajasthan. She motivated everyone to actively participate in the workshop and openly share their views in order to successfully achieve the objectives of the workshop. Special Guest,

Dr. Rajkumari Bhargav, who is also a member of Child Welfare Committee, admired the efforts of conducting a regional level event focusing on the welfare of children. Dr. Shailendra then briefed about the activities to be conducted throughout the workshop. He informed about the flow of events and the structure of the program. After that children performed cultural programs were there such as dance and songs to make the environment enthusiastic for the children's and ensure their maximum participation in the consultation/event.

SESSION 2

Group Activities:

Resource Person: Mr. Mahesh Kumar (Sandhaan, Jaipur), Ms. Sindhu Binujeet (Child Protection Consultant, UNICEF), Mr. Manish Sharma (GSS, Udaipur), Ms. Vinita (Representative from Jaipur), Mr. Gajendra Singh and Mr. Harish Chanderiya (Save the Children, Dungarpur), Dr. Veena Dwivedi (Assistant Professor, Udaipur School of Social Work), Dr. Shilpa Mehta (Foster Care Society), Ms. Garima Shekhawat (Teacher, R.B.S.S, Residency)

After that, children were divided into 6 different groups with different themes each which were headed by the experts of those issues. The groups brainstormed on the work which upcoming government should perform in the context of children's rights and protection. Under different themes, participants discussed on various issues and topics such as problems encountered in schools and villages, self-

defence practices which include dissemination of proper knowledge among children about good touch and bad touch.

The NGO representatives discussed the issues and challenges faced while working for the protection and welfare of children's rights. They suggested changes at policy level as well. The group activity was one of the main exercises in the formulation of charter of demands. Children from different backgrounds came together for the first time in the region to discuss on the issues which affects them on daily basis and contributed to finalise the demands to be included in the manifesto of the major political parties in the upcoming assembly elections.

The first group was mentored by Mr. Mahesh Kumar, representative of Sandhaan Jaipur and discussed on the current scenario of the education system in the region and steps which are needed to fill the gaps between the child and access to quality education.

The second group focused and discussed on the current health issues of the region and was facilitated by Mr. Manish Sharma, representative of Gayatri Seva Sansthan. The group had an interactive discussion on how still in rural areas of southern Rajasthan, lack of access to health services and infrastructure is creating problems on daily basis. The group came up with measure and steps need to be taken in the direction of improving health services and deliveries.

The third group put an emphasis on the issue of Child Protection and was headed by the expert Vinita, representative from Jaipur. All participants discussed various forms of exploitations, violence, neglect and abuse on children in the region and preventive steps which are required in this field. Participants also discussed on existing sets of laws, regulations and services which exists in the field of Child Protection and how to strengthen them.

The fourth group was facilitated by Mr. Gajendra Singh and Harish Chanderia, representative of Save the Children Dungarpur. This group discussed in detail the importance of Child Right to Participation. Children can play an important role as agents of transformation and shall be involved in the decision making process. Children shall be able to freely share their views, experiences and opinions on all matters and issues which affect them at different levels - family, institutional, schools, government etc.

The fifth group was facilitated by Dr. Veena Dwivedi on Child development and related aspects. The group had a detailed discussion on biological, psychological and emotional challenges that occurs within a child.

Session -3 (Second day of Consultation chaired by Mr. Raghuveer Meena)

Dr. Shailendra Pandya (Child Right Expert & Convenor at BSN, Udaipur), Raghuveer Singh Meena (Member of All India Congress Manifesto Committee), Laxmi Narayan Pandya (Purv Up Zila Pramukh, Udaipur).

Presentations by the Participants (Groups) - The group discussions were followed by presentations given by participants to further the process of developing the charter of demands. They emphasized the need for more scholarship programs for higher education, problems associated with shortage of female teachers in schools and discrimination faced by them in the schools as well as community. Due to social evils prevailing in our culture, desires and wants are subdued especially of girls. Girls demanded to urge schools in making the sanitary napkins available in the schools. Many schools lack library where as

some have the library which stays closed always. The demand to begin functional libraries at school was one of the major issues discussed. Inclusion of “sex education” in schools should be a necessary part of the curriculum. Availability of lab facilities, counselling centres and health facilities are crucial for effective and quality education. Self-defense classes, complaint box, helpline numbers, regular health checkups and introduction of new technology in schools/ colleges were some of the other issues which were discussed with insightful inputs by the experts.

Finalising the Charter - Following the group presentation, the team of experts along with children started drafting the final version of the charter which will bring in most important demands of children. The experts also identified leaders from different groups who will present those demands to major political parties. After spending considerable amount of time and having a detailed discussion, the demands were selected which need urgent actions. All experts have really appreciated and were impressed by the active participation of children for bringing in real issues which affect children on daily basis. Leaders were excited and enthusiastic to present the charter to political representatives and to ensure that these demands will be included in the manifesto of both the major political parties.

SESSION 4

Resource Person - Dr. Shailendra Pandya (Child Right Expert & Convenor at BSN, Udaipur), Raghuveer Singh Meena (Member of All India Congress Manifesto Committee), Chandragupta Singh (General Secretary of Bhartiya Janata Party), Laxmi Narayan Pandya (Purv Up Zila Pramukh, Udaipur).

Submission & Acceptance of the Charter - Dr. Shailendra Pandya, Child Protection Specialist and Convener of Bal Suraksha Network addressed and presented the audience with demands emerged out from the two-day regional workshop and informed that the experts will send out the detailed report of the *Charter of Demands* to all political parties. Chief Guest of the second day, Raghuveer Singh Meena who is also a member of *National Congress Working Committee*, New Delhi and *All India Congress Manifesto Committee*, applauded this unique initiative and promised the children to include their demands’ charter in not only state but national level manifesto of their party. Chandragupta Singh, General Secretary of Bhartiya Janata Party, expressed his acceptance of the charter and promised to include it in the party’s manifesto as it is. He assured that he would pass on this charter to be included at center level as well. He informed the audience that BJP government is planning and is already making changes in the curriculum. He also shared examples of how we have to bring change in the society. Laxmi Narayan Pandya, special guest and *Purva Zila Up Pramukh*, expressed that children are the future of our nation. Their demands must be included in the manifesto of all the political parties. Children will play an important role in the development of the nation and hence it is essential to ensure that their voices are heard. He thanked and congratulated everyone to participate in this historical event.

RESULTS OF THE CONSULTATION:

1. 43% of the population in Rajasthan is under 18 years of age, which is approximately half of the total population. But the total budget allocated for the children is 18%; this should be increased.
2. According to the Integrated Child Protection Scheme (ICPS), formulation of Child Protection Committees is essential at the block and the district level but very less work has been done in this direction. The government shall ensure that these Child Protection Committees will be created at all levels.
3. If tribal children of Southern Rajasthan are empowered towards sports activities then definitely many players can reach and perform at International level. Therefore, government shall establish Sports Academy in Udaipur district.
4. Majority of the tribes live in forest areas. Many times, Forest department displaces them without keeping in mind the appropriate living conditions for the children which affects all the children of the family. The government shall ensure safety and protection of the children prior to any such displacement processes or actions.
5. It shall be ensured that Child help line is established in both urban and rural areas of every district. 6. At all divisional and district level, it shall be ensured that necessary homes (girls' home, children's home, baby home, protection homes) are established for children with care and protection needs.
7. On the basis of excellent and ideal schools, **Bal Mitra Village Panchayat** shall be formulated under Panchayati Raj Institutions.
8. To ensure provisions given under Right to Education Act (RTE) are followed, especially Teacher-Pupil ratio, separate toilets for boys and girls, quality nutrition and effective implementation of Bal Sansad.
9. Rajasthan Government shall be determined towards the aim of creating Rajasthan a Child labor and Child Beggar-free state.
10. Education system shall also add and focus on vocational studies and life skills (Physical changes/Health).
11. There shall be an appointment of Paediatrician and Gynaecologist in government hospitals at the block level.
12. De-Addiction and Counselling centres shall be established for Adolescents at the district level.
13. In every school and hostel where girls are studying, it shall be compulsory to have female teacher and female warden.
14. All talented students shall be provided with scholarships, sports and other paid benefits regardless of their caste.

Major Issues discussed by the Children:

Major issues discussed in the consultation were Poor education quality, lack of IT infrastructure, lack of scholarship for higher studies, Library, regular availability of teacher etc. Health issues related to adolescent girls regarding their menstrual problems, lack of sanitary pads, separate toilets for the girls in govt. school and lack of health services. Child safety and protection of rights, child labour, child trafficking, child marriage, lack of shelter homes and rehabilitation shelters for needy children (beggars, drug abuser etc.) Children are the change-makers for social transformation and shall be involved in the decision-making process. Children shall be able to freely share their views and experiences at different levels - family, institutional, schools, government etc.

Conclusion:

Two day event with the theme “Dasham” – Participation of Children in Democracy was organised by the help of UNICEF, Resource for Human Rights and Bal Suraksha Network at Khelgaon, Udaipur from Aug 31st to Sept 01st, 2018. Dr. Shailendra Pandya (Convenor, Bal Suraksha Network) and Dr. Sindhu Binurjeet (State representative of UNICEF) chair the event. It was the first Consultation/Event in history itself that children (below 18 yrs) who have no right to choose the democracy. But this time, children will define their own demands and views that what they want for their better future and both the major political parties assured that they will include their demand charter in their manifesto of 2019 General Election. Children from different background such as remote areas of Pratapgarh, orphanage, govt. & private schools of Udaipur division etc participated actively and raised all type of major points i.e. quality education, life skills during their school education, violation of children’s right, scholarship for higher studies, health aspects for the adolescent girl in school etc. After that children were divided into groups with the mentors to discuss child related issues and above points. After discussion in group, children prepare the charter in their respective group with the guidance of mentor (participants from different agencies). Every group presented their charter and after studying all the charter by child right experts and other professionals, a consolidated charter was prepared to present in front of political party representative.

On Second day of event, Consolidated Charter was presented by the group of children in front of Raghuvveer Singh Meena (Member of All India Congress Manifesto Committee) and Chandragupta Singh (General Secretary of Bhartiya Janata Party). Each point (issue) of charter was explained. After listening all the points (issues), both the party leader accepted that whatever children have mentioned in charter is actual at ground level. During their speech, both the political leader promised that their party will involve the charter in their manifesto of 2019 General Election.

As a part of the closure, Dr. Shailendra Pandya, (Child Right Expert & Convenor, Bal Suraksha Network) expressed gratitude to Ms. Sindhu Binurjeet (Child Protection Consultant, UNICEF), Dr. Rajkumari Bhargav (Member, Child Welfare Committee), Representative of Political Party Chandragupta Singh (General Secretary of Bhartiya Janata Party), Raghuvveer Singh Meena (Member of All India Congress Manifesto Committee), Laxmi Narayan Pandya (*Purv Up Zila Pramukh*, Udaipur) and all the other participants, representative of different agencies, children’s of different schools, orphanage and shelter homes etc.

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HISTORICAL REGIONAL EVENT IN THE STATE: BOTH MAJOR POLITICAL PARTIES ACCEPTED CHARTER OF DEMANDS SUBMITTED BY CHILDREN FOR THEIR MANIFESTO



UDAIPUR: The historical event was conducted to discuss upon the priority issues and problems faced by children which must be included in the manifestos of different political parties in the upcoming assembly elections of Rajasthan. In order to pitch the issues and problems among various political parties, and incorporate those points in their manifestos, the campaign was launched with the name 'Dasha - Dasha' (Ten Children Charter of demands) by BAL SURAKSHA NETWORK Udaipur in joint collaboration with UNICEF and RESOURCE INSTITUTE FOR HUMAN RIGHTS, JAIPUR. As a part of the campaign, the first district level workshop was organized at the Youth Hostel, Khetraj, Udaipur from 31st August to 1st September 2018. The vision of the workshop was to organize different events at block, district and regional level on the issues of child protection and forward crucial issues to the major political parties. The workshop

was attended by more than 150 children from different blocks of the region, representatives of agencies working for children's welfare and other concerned departments, who together developed and presented the children charter of demands which are needed to be included in the manifestos of children along with experts had an extensive discussion through various interactive activities and presented the charter of demands during the closure part of the regional workshop. Dr. Rajkumar Pandya, member of Child Welfare Committee advised the efforts of organizing a regional level event focusing on the welfare of children. Dr. VandeDwivedi, Professor from Udaipur School of Social Work, Vijay Goyal and Mahesh Kumar Sharma, Rajasthan Child Rights Campaign, Dr. Shilpa Mehta, Foster Care Society, D.K. Gupta, Child Welfare Committee Udaipur, Subhash Joshi, Secretary Gayatri Seva Sansthan and Majorie from Unnatigandhar, also presented their views and appreciated this first ever historical event in the state. Dr. Shailendra Pandya, Child Protection Specialist and

Convenor of BalSuraksha Network addressed and presented the audience with demands emerged out from the two-day regional workshop and informed that the experts will send out the detailed report of the Charter of Demands to all political parties. Issues to be included in the charter of demands: 1. 43% of the population in Rajasthan is under 18 years of age, which is approximately half of the total population. But the total budget allocated for the children is 16%, this should be increased. 2. According to the Integrated Child Protection Scheme (ICPS), formulation of Child Protection Committees is essential at the block and district level but very less work has been done in this direction. The government shall ensure that these Child Protection Committees will be created at all levels. 3. If total children of Southern Rajasthan are empowered towards sports activities then definitely many players can reach and perform at international level. Therefore, government shall establish Sports Academy in Udaipur district. 4. Majority of the tribes in forest areas. Many times, Forest department displace them without keeping in mind the appropriate living conditions for the children which affects all the children of the family. The government shall ensure safety and protection of the children prior to any such displacement processes or actions.

5. It shall be ensured that Child help line is established in both urban and rural areas of every district. 6. At all divisional and district level, it shall be ensured that necessary homes (children's home, shelter homes, girls' home) are established for children with care and protection needs. 7. On the basis of excellent and model schools, Balika Village Counseling centers shall be established for Adolescents of the district level. 13. In every school and hostel where girls are studying, it shall be compulsory to have female teacher and female warden. 14. All talented students shall be provided with scholarships, sports and other paid benefits regardless of their caste. In the occasion, Shrija Singh

Parichayal shall be formulated under Panchayati Raj institutions. 8. To ensure provisions given under Right to Education Act (RTE) are followed, especially Teacher-Pupil ratio, separate toilets for boys and girls, quality nutrition and a focus on implementation of Sarva Shiksha. 9. Rajasthan Government shall be determined towards the aim of creating Rajasthan a Child labor and Child Beggar free state. 10. Education system shall also add and focus on vocational studies and life skills (Physical change/health). 11. There shall be an appointment of Pediatrician and Gynecologist in government hospitals at the block level. 12. De-Addiction and

Pedmapur, the Coordinator of BalSuraksha Network, expressed the gratitude and thanked UNICEF, Save the Children, Plan International, World Vision, Gayatri Seva Sansthan, Swa Aasa VansSansthan, SevaAarati, Foster Care Society, Mahesh Seva Sansthan, Aarti Sansthan, Child Welfare Committee and students and teachers from various government and private schools including Balika Gita Chitraghar, Neelashri Bal Gita Udaipur, Upper Primary Residential Government School, and AshrayaDarshak Seva Sansthan for their valuable time and suggestions, and active participation in the workshop which turned it into a vibrant event.
